REMEMBRANCE DAY: On Wednesday,
November 11, 2020, 102 years have
passed since the signing of the
armistice that officially ended WW1 &
on Sept. 2nd, 75 years since the end of
the Second World War

WW1 - The war to end all wars left an indelible impression on Canada. Some 619,636 Canadians enlisted with the Canadian Expeditionary Force and approximately 424,000 served overseas. Close to 61,000 Canadians were killed and another 172,000 were wounded. Many more returned home broken in mind and body.

The Red Poppy of Flanders is immortalized as an emblem of sacrifice and remembrance for the honoring of the thousands who laid down their lives for those ideals which we, as Canadians cherish.

Let us remember the lives lost during one of the most trying periods in modern human history.

For all who lost their lives in war – may they be in the company of God, the Angels and the Saints forever.
